### **Tolulope Popoola's *Lagos Flash Fiction Series* Captures the Soul of a City in 1,000 Words or Less**

Readers are introduced to:

- Bisi, the no-nonsense wedding planner who handles everything from cheating grooms to runaway brides.
- CJ, a seasoned groomsman whose wedding-day interventions are as frequent as they are necessary, yet he remains single.

- Dayo, an IT-professional-turned-baker, navigating both fondant and Lagos madness in equal measure.
- Ladi, a former banker turned Uber driver, whose passengers' stories rival his own.
- Onome, a young banker juggling microaggressions, customer tantrums, and a side hustle in jewellery while dreaming of Canada.

Together, they build a shared tapestry of Lagos life: a city that tests, teaches, and transforms.

### **Why Flash Fiction?**

"I've always been fascinated by Lagos; its madness, its vibrancy, its rhythm," says Popoola in a recent interview. "Flash fiction was the perfect medium to capture those everyday slices of life: quick, relatable, and full of heart."

With its brisk pacing and twist-laden scenes, the series is tailor-made for today's time-starved reader. Each volume is ideal for commuters, busy professionals, or anyone seeking an immersive literary escape without a 400-page commitment.

Following the success of this six-book series, Popoola confirms more titles are in development, including *Memoirs of a Lagos School Teacher* and *Memoirs of a Lagos Makeup Artist*. Discussions are underway for a screen adaptation, and readers may soon see their favourite characters come to life in a Lagos-based web series.
